We have had an exciting start to 2025 with a very busy January indeed – I can't believe how quickly this year is flying in! We have already had our **Enrolment** for our new Primary 1's in August 2025 and we look now to working with our partners to begin the **Transition Programme** for our P7children moving to High School.

Please come in through the main office door)

We love to **celebrate Scotland** here at Harestanes and this year we had to postpone our **Scottish Assembly** - thanks to **Storm Eowyn** - but it did go ahead a week later! Our Assembly also included a presentation on Robert Burns **organised by our P7 pupils** who shared the history of Robert Burns and re-enacted parts of the traditional Burns supper. We have been continuing to work on **our School Improvement Plan** concentrating on Raising Attainment in Reading across the school to **Gold Level** and working towards becoming **a Silver Level** Rights Respecting School.Our **Pupil Reading Leaders** have been busy over the past two terms reorganizing our school library and continuing to raise the profile of reading across the school. As a result of their work, pupils have been **sharing book**

Our Reading Leaders went on a trip to our local library in Kirkintilloch to get some **ideas and inspiration** for our **own library** and reading areas. the school library full of novels by authors and genres of books that were requested by pupils. We will also be asking teachers and pupils to regularly **share what they are reading** and **inviting families in to attend more after-school story sessions**.
